Wet weather slows Sump 58 work

Wet weather over the course of the last month has slowed our progress to complete work along Garden Highway, and is expected to prolong the closure of Garden Highway between Northgate Blvd and Natomas Park Drive. While the seepage cutoff wall is in place, we are still completing our work at Sump 58, which helps remove interior drainage water from the neighborhood to the creek for the safety of the neighborhood. As you can see in the attached pictures, Sump 58's discharge pipes run from the landside of Garden Highway across the levee road to the creek. This underground work prevents us from being able to reopen the road until this work is complete. We now expect Garden Highway to remain closed for a couple more weeks, reopening in Mid-February. We apologize for this continued inconvenience but appreciate your patience as we complete this vital flood risk reduction work.
