Boxes 1-10 must be completed to include all information required by General Condition 32. Box 11 (or other sufficient information to show compliance with all General Conditions) must be completed for activities in Arizona, California, Nevada, and Utah, and is recommended for activities in Colorado and New Mexico. If additional space is needed, please provide as a separate attachment. Please refer to the Instructions for the South Pacific Division Nationwide Permit Pre-Construction Notification (PCN) (Instructions) for instructions for completing the PCN, as well as additional information on the attachments and tables included with this PCN that may be used.

Contents of a Complete Application/PCN Continued..

- 1. Name, address, and telephone numbers of the prospective permittee;
- 2. Location of the proposed activity;
- 3. Identify the specific NWP or NWP(s) the prospective permittee wants to use to authorize the proposed activity;



Contents of a Complete Application/PCN Continued..

- 4. (1) Description of the proposed activity
 - (2) Activity's purpose
 - (3) Direct & indirect adverse environmental effects including anticipated amount of loss of wetlands, other special aquatic sites, or other WOUS in acres, linear feet, or other appropriate measure
 - (4) Description of proposed mitigation measures to reduce adverse environmental effects (not compensatory mitigation)
 - (5) Any other permits used/intended to be used to authorize any part of project or any related activity, including other separate/distant crossings for linear projects that require DA permit but not PCN
 - (6) Sketches containing sufficient detail to provide description of proposed activity

Delineation of aquatic resources, including wetlands

 List of potentially affected listed species or designated habitat (Section 7 ESA)

 List of potentially affected historic properties (Section 106 NHPA)



2021 NWPs General Conditions

- Address compliance with each general condition (or N/A)
- Common to use supplemental pages to the application.





2021 NWP Regional Conditions

- No PCN Regional Conditions
- Overall: simplified compared to 2017 NWP Regional Conditions
- Remember to use current Regional Conditions

Final 2021 Nationwide Permit (NWP) Regional Conditions for the State of California

(Effective February 25, 2022 until March 14, 2026)


A. Regional Conditions for the State of California:

- 1. The permittee shall submit a pre-construction notification (PCN), in accordance with General Condition 32, in the following circumstances:
- a. Activities involving new bank stabilization that do not incorporate bioengineering techniques. Bioengineering techniques include using live plants alone or in combination with dead or inorganic materials, including rock, sand, or gravel;
- b. Activities resulting in a discharge of dredged or fill material in waters of the U.S. on Tribal lands¹;
- c. Activities involving the permanent channelization, realignment, or relocation of streams; and,
- d. Activities that have the potential to adversely affect Essential Fish Habitat (EFH), as designated by the Pacific Fishery Management Council. The PCN shall include an EFH assessment and analysis of effects of the action on EFH, in accordance with 50 C.F.R. § 600.920 (e). For Federal permittees, if a PCN is required for the proposed activity, the Federal permittee must provide the district engineer with the appropriate documentation to demonstrate compliance with the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act.
- 2. In the Sacramento District, the use of any NWP (except NWPs 3, 6, 16, 20, 24, 27, 37, 38, 52, 53, and 59) authorizing the discharge of dredged or fill material in peatlands² containing histosols, including bogs and fens, is prohibited.

Information NOT required for a complete PCN... but

- Biological assessment/information sufficient to initiate consultation for Section 7 ESA
- Cultural resources report/other information sufficient to initiate consultation for Section 106 NHPA
- Verified aquatic resource delineation
- Proposed compensatory mitigation for less than 1/10 acre wetlands or any amount of other special aquatic sites or other waters of the U.S.
- Draft/Final mitigation/monitoring plan/long-term management plan for proposed permittee-responsible compensatory mitigation
- Section 401 CWA permits

GUIDELINES FOR COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 106 OF THE NATIONAL HISTORIC PRESERVATION ACT March 24, 2014

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Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended (NHPA), requires Federal agencies to take into account the effects of their undertakings on Historic Properties and afford the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation a reasonable opportunity to comment on such undertakings. Therefore, prior to the issuance or authorization of any permit under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act or Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Sacramento District, Regulatory Division (Corps) must consider the effect the permit may have on Historic Properties. Historic Properties may include prehistoric or historic districts, sites, buildings, structures, objects, sacred sites, and traditional cultural places, that are included in, or eligible for inclusion in, the National Register of Historic Places.



Timeframes, Continued

As part of the tentative 60-day processing timeframe:

- Endangered Species Act and Essential Fish Habitat
- ▶ Internal Corps Coordination
- After the resolution of the last sub-action, the Project Manager has 15 days to issue the verification letter.



ESA INFORMATION GUIDELINES FOR THE REGULATORY PROGRAM

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March 2018

Section 7(a)(2) of the Endangered Species Act (ESA) requires Federal agencies, in consultation with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and National Marine Fisheries Service (Services), to ensure that actions authorized, funded, or carried out by that agency are not likely to jeopardize the continued existence of any Federally-listed endangered or threatened species. Therefore, before any activity can be authorized by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Sacramento District Regulatory Division (Corps) under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act or Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act, we must ensure that the project is in compliance with the ESA. The Sacramento District has developed this guidance in coordination with the Services to improve the quality of the ESA information the District submits to the Services when initiating consultation under the federal Endangered Species Act.
