Findings for: SPK-2008-01069, ED1

This feature is the lower portion of a natural drainage carrying water into the American River from the adjacent flood plain. Much of the flood plain drained by this feature has been paved to create parking for the Nimbus Fish Hatchery. The feature has a defined bed and bank and flows at a minimum, during and immediately after storm events. The drainage conveys all flows, including pollutants that may be found in the adjacent parking lot, directly into the TNW.

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B. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS TO SUPPORT JD:

Description

This drainage has been identified by the consultant as ephemeral. It carries water from within developed portions of the floodplain and surrounding areas directly to the American River. This feature serves as an important connection between the river and its floodplain, conveying all flows, including pollutants that may be found in the adjacent parking lot, directly into the TNW. Refer to JD SPK-2008-99 for the Traditional Navigable Water Navigable-in-Fact determination for this reach of the American River.


